In the Beginning

In 1873, oldest record of school building on Oakwood Blvd across from the cemetery.

A one-room, school house cost \$432.60, with 41 students, by 1 teacher..a man, only 6 months of school.




The 1st 2 story school built about 1891.

Erma Lovett, Julane Hansan, Paul Freeman, and Ted Brown stood outside the Pleasant Hill school in 1934 of this class photo.



This is the first lower elementary class, kindergarten through fourth grade, that attended the new


Pleasant Hill school. The teacher is Ruth Foster, who still teaches today in Des Moines.

First School Built about 1870 used until 1891 Used as Temporary school 1930-31 And again 1943-44




Fourth School Built 1945-1963 Now used as City Hall
